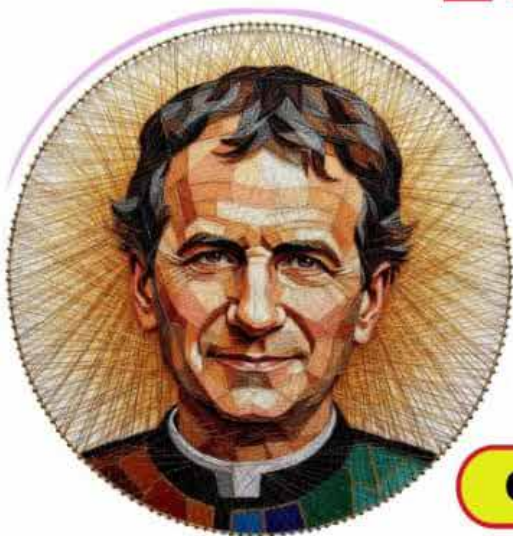

Welcome to Don Bosco College Higher Secondary Section- Tura, an educational institution of the Catholic Church, belonging to the global Don Bosco Society and managed by the “Salesians of Don Bosco - North East India”, headquartered in Guwahati, Assam.

The Higher Secondary Section was an integral part of Don Bosco College Tura which was established in 1987 with the intention of bringing higher education within the reach of the people of Garo Hills. The management of the college decided to de-link the Higher Secondary Section from the main college campus in 2014 with a view to ensure quality education at the Plus Two level. Today, the strength of the teaching staff in the Higher Secondary Section is 45 and the college caters to over 1500 students. The college continues to ceaselessly strive for quality education.

DON BOSCO

The College is named after St. John Bosco, popularly known as Don Bosco, the founder of the religious and educational society "Salesians of Don Bosco." Don Bosco was born of a very poor family in 1815, near Turin, Italy. By dint of hard work and heroic sacrifices he became a priest in 1841. He dedicated himself to the service of poor youth as a caring father, offering them food, shelter and education. He opened for them day and night shelters, academic and technical schools, hostels and places of spirituality and prayer. He founded a society of collaborators and extended his work to all Europe and eventually to all continents. Don Bosco died on 31 January 1888 and was declared a saint on 1 April 1934.

DON BOSCO'S PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION

Don Bosco based his system of education on the three pillars of "Reason, Religion and Kindness". He did not visualize education in isolation from the needs of the community. Vocational guidance, training and job placement were integral to his scheme of things.

Accordingly at Don Bosco College Higher Secondary Section we believe in:

2. Creating an educative family of students, staff and management, marked by transparency, mutual respect, constant interaction and caring support;

Though Don Bosco had not travelled to India, in a vision in 1886 he had seen Calcutta on the map of the countries where his followers would work. The Salesians came to India in 1906. They now number about 3000 and are engaged in numerous schools, technical schools, colleges and a university. They also render services in skill building and offer assistance to youth at risk.

ELIGIBILITY

Arts	The candidate should obtain 50% marks at CL. X.
Commerce	The candidate should obtain 55% marks at CL. X and 55% for Mathematics.
Science	The candidate should obtain 70% marks at CL. X and 70% for Mathematics.

SCIENCE COACHING FOR NEET / AIIMS / JEE EXAMINATIONS

1. Don Bosco College Higher Secondary Section offers 2-Year integrated, on-campus coaching for CL. XI / XII students. It is mandatory for cl. XI & XII Science.
2. The coaching will prepare the students for JEE, AIIMS and NEET entrance examinations for Medical and Engineering courses as well as for the Higher Secondary examinations.
3. The Coaching will include Study materials and regular Mock Tests designed to prepare students for the entrance examinations.
4. No additional fee to be paid for the coaching.



ADMISSION PROCESS

1. Admission Forms	Application forms for admission to Higher Secondary Arts, Science and Commerce are issued from 6 th April 2026 onwards on payment of Rs. 700.
2. Documents to be Attached	Photostat copies of the following documents are to be submitted along with the application form: a) Admit Card of CL. X Examination b) Mark Sheet of CL. X Examination c) Pass Certificate of CL. X Examination d) Registration Card of CL. X e) Transfer Certificate from school last attended f) Character Certificate from school last attended g) Migration Certificate (to be submitted later, in original, by students from schools outside MBOSE) h) Birth Certificate i) ST/SC/OBC Certificate, if applicable j) Recommendation of Parish Priest in original (for Catholic Students Only)
3. Submission of Forms	a) Forms are to be submitted within the notified dates, after declaration of CL. X results. b) The originals of all documents are to be produced for verification at the time of interview. c) Incomplete forms will be rejected. d) If any statement furnished by the candidate is found to be false at any time, his/her admission is liable to be cancelled.
4. Interview & Test	a) Admission is granted on the basis of performance at qualifying examination, entrance test and interview. b) Candidates will be interviewed and given an admission test at the time of form submission.
5. Admission	a) The list of admitted candidates will be displayed on the college notice board. The candidates can also get the admission result over telephone. b) Admitted candidates should submit to the college office 3 copies admit card, mark sheet, pass certificate, registration card and caste certificate for future use.
6. Payment of Fees	a) Admission fees must be paid within the due date failing which the admission will stand cancelled. b) College Fees may be paid directly to A/c No. 33223821907 of "Don Bosco College Tura" (State Bank of India, IFS Code: SBIN0007332) using College Fee Book in which Application Form No. and Name of student should be entered. c) Payment of Fees will not be accepted at any of the college counters.

- The above fees do not include MBOSE Registration & Examination fees.
 - Fees are for 12 months. Fees may be paid on any day within the month, failing which a late fine will be charged as per the Fine Schedule. Fees to be cleared before the Promotion Examination (January 2026).
 - Fees once paid are not refundable.
 - Those wishing to take Transfer Certificate during the year must clear dues up to the end of the academic year.
 - Monthly fees are to be paid by 10th of each month, failing which a fine of Rs. 10/- will be charged for each month of delay. No fine will be charged for late payment of fees from April – September if it is cleared before 10th of September.



GENERAL COLLEGE RULES

1. Attendance

Eighty five percent (85%) attendance is compulsory. Attendance of students will be monitored on a regular basis and attendance statements will be displayed on the notice board every fortnight. Students should enter their attendance percentage in the Handbook and get it countersigned by their class teacher. Students having less than 85% attendance may be asked to appear before the Principal / Attendance Committee. Unauthorised absence beyond 85% each month will attract fines as per the Fine Schedule.

Students with below Eighty percent (80%) attendance may face the risk of their Examination Application forms not being forwarded to Meghalaya Board of School Education (MBOSE).

2. Leave

Students should submit leave applications, on prescribed form, for every absence, including leave for medical treatment. While medical certificates may explain absence, they are not a substitute for attendance.

3. Dress

Dress and appearance of the students must be in good taste. Students are to come to college neatly dressed, in the college uniform. Makeup and fancy hair styles are to be avoided. Boys and girls are to wear trousers, shirts/tops/T-shirts, neckties, blazers and shoes of colour specified by the college.

4. Identity Cards

Identity cards should be brought daily to college and worn round the neck. Identity cards should be produced for every type of transaction in the college.



5. Assignments

Regular assignments and home works in each subject will have to be done by the students under the guidance of the concerned departmental staff.

6. Examinations

The college conducts regular class tests and unit tests. Attendance in these tests is compulsory. The performance of a student in the tests is taken into consideration at the time of admitting him/her to Board Examinations.

7. Mentoring

Students will be divided into groups and assigned teachers who will act as mentors to the group. Mentors will guide the students by monitoring, assessment and motivation.

8. Mobile Phones

Mobile phones are not to be used within the college building without permission. Phones will be confiscated and returned only as per the Fine Schedule.

9. Permissions

Permission to leave the college early will be granted only after the parent / guardian has telephoned the college authorities from telephone numbers registered with the college at the time of admission. Requests from non-registered phones will not be entertained.

10. Substance Abuse

Smoking, alcoholic drinks and drugs are forbidden within and outside the campus. Anyone found indulging in these substances will have their parents summoned and fines and sanctions will be imposed as per the Fine Schedule.

11. Fines

Fines, as per notified Fine Schedule, may be levied for violation of rules on attendance, dress, behaviour and damages.



12. Non-serious students

Students who are not serious about studies and are not prepared to give their best by way of attendance, study and discipline should not seek admission to this college. They face the risk of failing and losing years.

13. Request to Parents

Parents are requested to keep track of the performance of their children in attendance, tests and discipline by visiting or telephoning the Principal.
